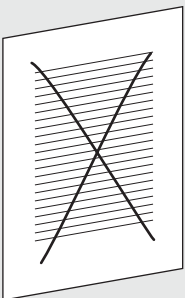
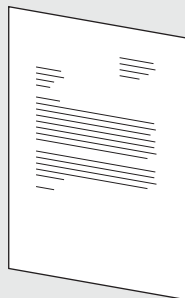

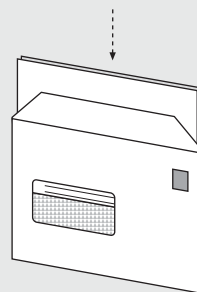

Dear Mr Miliband,

You've said that you'd like to see more people show that they care and are ready to act to prevent climate change. So I am writing to show you that I am concerned and have been trying to change my habits to be more resourceful and lead a less environmentally damaging lifestyle. As you can see from the makeshift nature of this letter, I am embracing the "reduce, reuse, recycle" philosophy.

However, I think you should also know that I've started to feel worried that this issue is bigger than all the small changes I can make, and would like to see the government do more to help to make the really big changes. I'm sure you already know the importance of the UN conference on climate change at Copenhagen in December. **I'd like to see you and your party do all you can to secure a deal to ensure that by 2050 we will have a cut global carbon emissions by at least 80% on 1990 levels**, anything less would mean this conference will have failed.

Knowing that world leaders are committing to serious action on this issue would make all the small changes that people like me are already making feel much more worth while. In the past it has felt like governments are following behind the public on this issue, waiting for us to make the necessary changes, but the problem is now so urgent that we need you to take the lead.

Please share this letter with your colleagues, citing it as an example of how voters in this country really are concerned about this issue.
